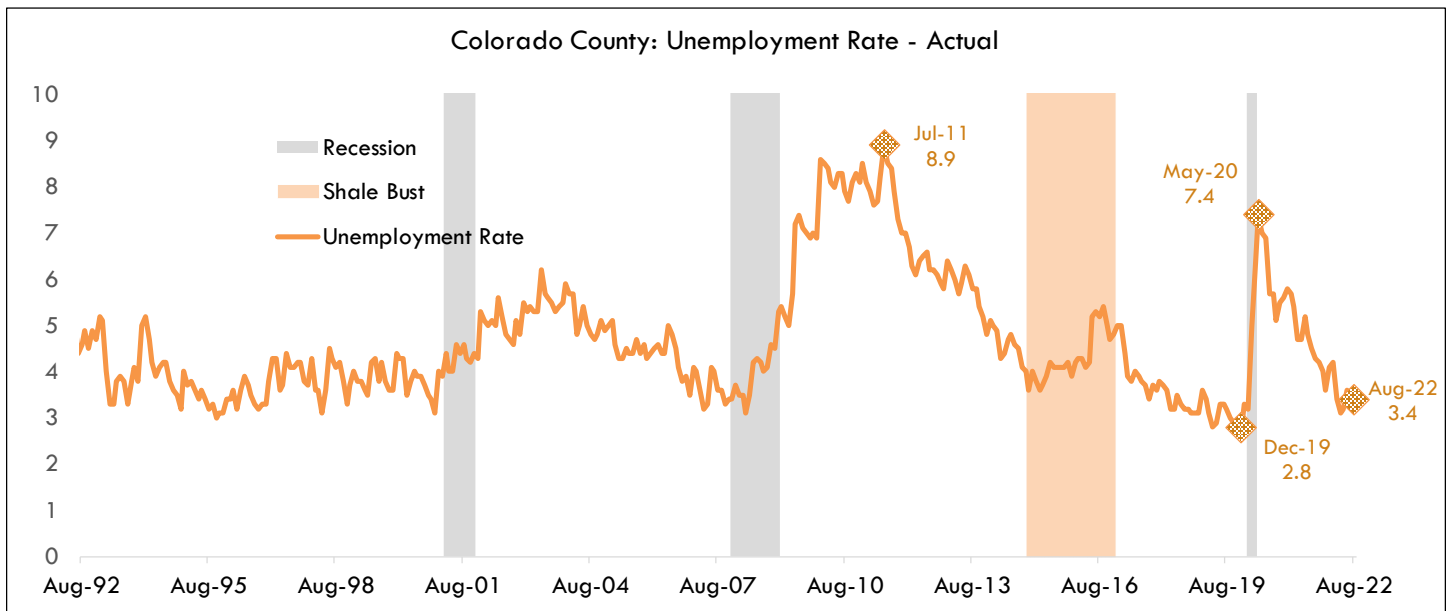

## County Employment Data\*

The rate of unemployment in Colorado County fell one-tenth of a percentage point to 3.4 percent in August. The county's rate of unemployment continues to be lower than the state and national rates. Total covered employment in the county was up 61 jobs or 0.9 percent over first quarter 2022. While the county typically incurs a seasonal decline in first quarter, gains in several industry sectors made the increase possible with Manufacturing up 52 jobs or 4.7 percent, Financial Activities up 26 jobs or 16.4 percent, and Trade, Transportation, and Utilities up 25 jobs or 1.7 percent. The only substantial decline was in Leisure and Hospitality, down 73 jobs or 9.6 percent. The county was up 236 jobs or 3.5 percent over the year in first quarter 2022. Largest contributors to the increase were Manufacturing, up 140 jobs or 13.6 percent, Natural Resources and Mining, up 72 jobs or 15.1 percent, and Trade, Transportation, and Utilities, up 55 jobs or 3.8 percent. The only substantial loss was in Leisure and Hospitality, down 52 jobs or 7.0 percent. Additional details can be found pages 2 through 7.

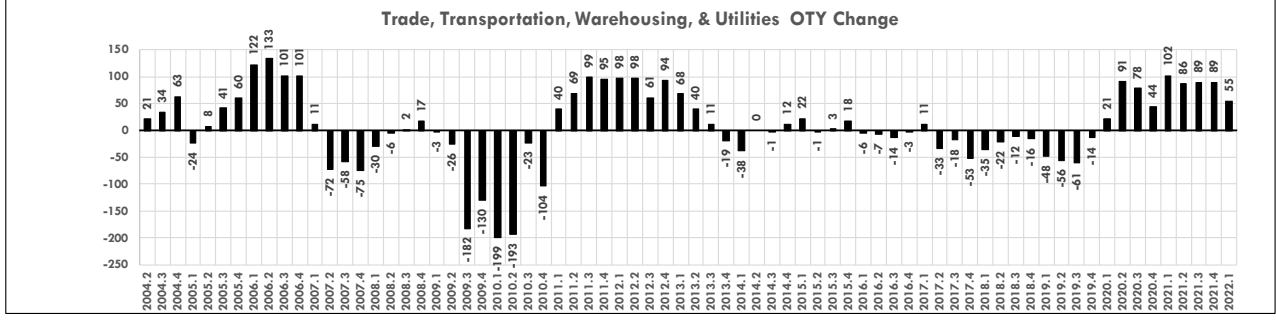
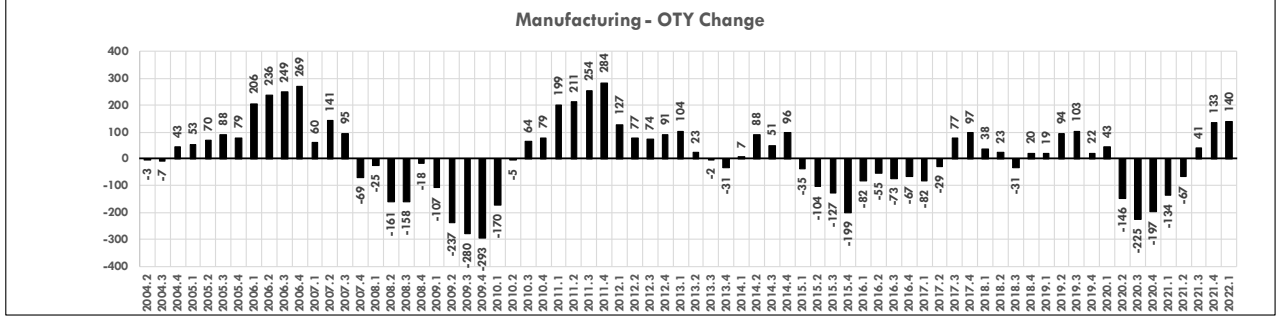
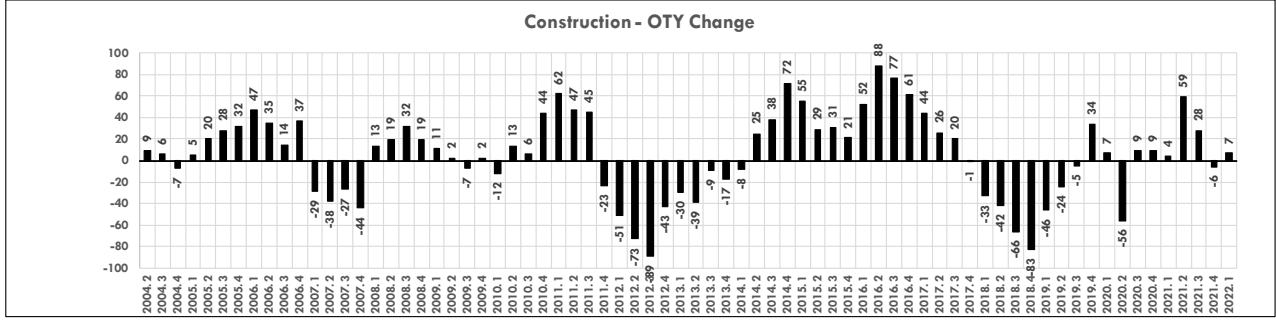
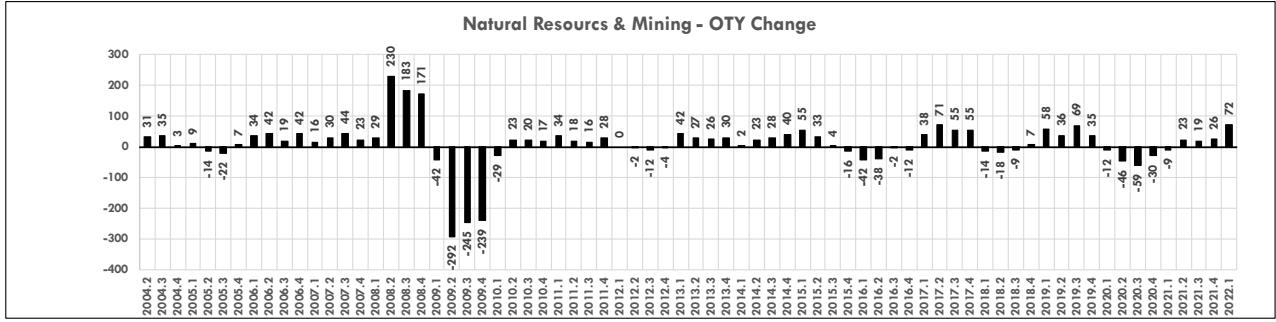
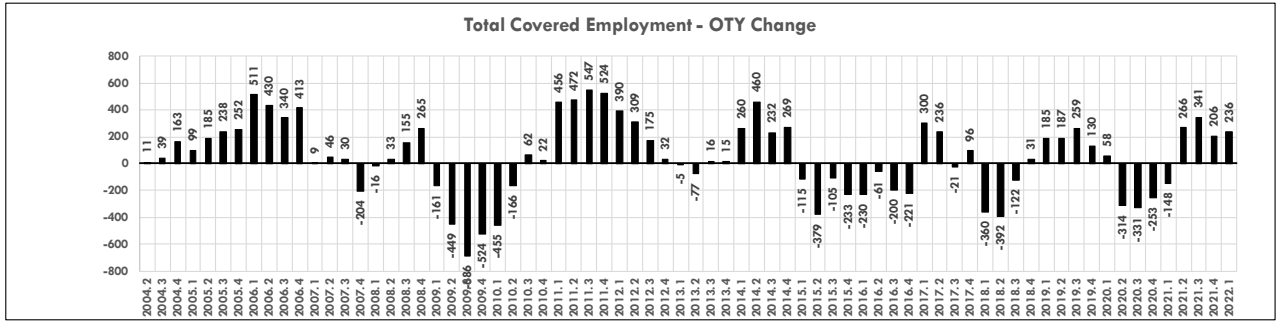

\*Data compiled by the Texas Workforce Commission, LMCI Dept. in cooperation with the Bureau of Labor Statistics as part of the Occupational Employment Survey. Employment is the estimate of employment based upon the sample, not the sample employment. Wages for the OES survey are straight-time, gross pay, exclusive of premium pay. Base rate, cost-of-living allowances, guaranteed pay, hazardous-duty pay, incentive pay including commissions and production bonuses, tips, and on-call pay are included. Excluded are back pay, jury duty pay, overtime pay, severance pay, shift differentials, nonproduction bonuses, employer cost of supplementary benefits, and tuition reimbursements. \*\*The Gulf Coast Region is defined as Austin, Brazoria, Chambers, Colorado, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Liberty, Matagorda, Montgomery, Walker, Waller, and Wharton Counties.
