Keeping Your Benefits Equals Looking For Work

Anyone receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits must be employed, or regularly or actively seeking employment.

State's Rules And Your Responsibilities

In Texas, receiving SNAP starts with you doing what the state asks you to do while you receive governmental help. You have to be looking for work or working to continue receiving SNAP.

We assess your work and educational skills and your family support needs to decide which of our services will best serve you.

Employment Plan - What You Must Do To Keep Your SNAP Benefits

- Look for work.
- Participate in the activities arranged by Workforce Solutions for _____ hours a week.
- Attend all scheduled appointments.
- Keep a paper record of activity hours.
- Report the hours weekly to _____ at Workforce Solutions on _____ day.
- Accept Workforce Solutions' job referrals.
- Accept a reasonable job offer and do your best to keep the job.
- Upon employment, call us at _____ to tell us when and where you work, and to let us know how we can continue to help you.
- If you're unable to find work within four weeks of beginning to receive SNAP benefits, we will talk to you about working in a community service job or other activity to gain experience and earn your benefits.

Failure To Follow An Employment Plan - What Happens If You Don't Follow The Plan?

If you do not follow the Employment Plan requirements and have no good reason for failing to meet those requirements, Workforce Solutions will contact the Texas Health and Human Services (HHS), which will stop providing you SNAP benefits.

Statement Of Agreement

I understand receiving SNAP means I must cooperate with the requirements of my Employment Plan or I will lose SNAP benefits. I understand I have the right to appeal any actions which deny my benefits by contacting the Texas Health and Human Services and asking about the right way to appeal.
